South Pacific report for the 26th March, 2020.

GREETINGS FROM DEEP DOWN IN THE SOUTH PACIFIC:

Where, I imagine, you might like to be at present. No deaths from the Chinese Communist Party Virus (CCPV) yet! But let me apologize for my long silence (although I have stayed in touch if you have emailed me) and give you the brief highlights of the past 3 months work. The fuller report will follow when I celebrate the completion of and move into my new office/library complex. And by the way. No N.Z. christian has been affected by the CCPV!

WORK HIGHLIGHTS:

The *Hutt work* was thundering along up until last week. The congregation has doubled in size since December 2019. I have been putting 2 days a week into this work. Find out the details in the fuller report to follow.

For 3 months I have worked 4 days a week (on average) in Wellington on a *TRUST property* to bring it to what was a 'sellers' market. Hopeful of increasing its value by over \$200k USD. I fuller explanation to come soon. But this work has kept me 'over-busy'..

The fund raising for the *Solomon Island Mission House* has almost been completed. The funds are safely stored in Decatur with my overseeing congregation. And when the CCPV thing is over, I will be heading to the Solomons to begin the final arrangements. In the meantime, we continue to support the *Alphonsus family* in the S.I. work.

The *Wairapapa work* has been slowed by the declining health of the key person in that region. Keep *Pedja Stanich* in your prayers as he completes his 2-5 remaining rounds of chemotherapy. He is responding well so far (he has CLL). I have one promising study underway in that region, but it is progressing slowly.

Am moving my 150 boxes of books, 7 filing cabinets, 10 boxes of DBBF resources and desks, computer and copier into my *new office/library complex* during this nationwide CCPV shutdown. It will take several more weeks to get everything sorted and working well. Thank you for your patience over my lack of organisation over the past 2 years as I have worked between offices..

PERSONAL:

Moved *Gaye* into a special care-unit in Palmerston North in January. She has been doing well although the isolation caused by the CCPV has upset her (and me).

All the *Kyles* are doing well. Both here in N.Z. and Australia.

The drought afflicting the Farmers of N.Z. has been broken today. Plenty of rain at present. Hence, I am in my home office sending you this report.
